Some clubs will not be expecting it.</p> <p>The SMUSA President shared she is thinking of ways to improve the process of integration as some exchange students are not aware of what clubs they can join. She also suggested having a list of clubs for the exchange students.</p> <p>In response, the CBd Presidents shared the following views and suggestions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- SSU President: Some clubs are more competitive in nature and hence it would be harder for exchange students to join club-level events for these clubs. However, it would be more possible for them to join school-wide events. Ultimately, each club EXCO has got its own vision. Honorary Finance Secretary – Sylvia Aw Su Wei

The Honorary Finance Secretary presented the budget for AY 2021-22 Semester 2 which was endorsed by the SAC Finance Committee at the Budget Endorsement Meeting (BEM). She shared that the purpose of the BEM was to allocate the Student Activity Fund, which comprises the nominal fees that every student pays, to the various student bodies.

The breakdown of the budget is as follows:

SMUSA EXCO + ICON - \$31,239.18

School CBds - \$43,949.78

CCA CBds - \$340,981.93

Total -\$416,170.89

The Secretary noted that many clubs could not spend their sourced income during the period from 2019 to 2021, and with their reserves clawed back, they had little sourced income left. Therefore, she encouraged the clubs to raise their club balance so that they would have an even higher safety net.

The Secretary then went on to explain the percentage change in the budget allocated to the various student bodies from the budget allocated during AY19/20 S2. In particular, she highlighted the following student bodies which had larger than average increments:

- ICON had an increment of 28.33% due to the addition of a new club, the Indian Cultural Society, which is one of the largest clubs in SMU, as well as an increase in the number of events held by ICON's smaller clubs.
- The Bar had an increment of 36.54% as it has a limited amount in its reserves and is planning to roll out more event and initiatives in this year.
